Ground Under Repair

White painted turf areas of regular or irregular shape on the course have been declared "ground under repair" for a competition and include where there is an active repair in process, as well as areas in need of repair where the repair is not yet in process. Competitors are not expected to play their ball from ground under repair, and thus generally receive relief of one club length no closer to the hole.

Examples of ground under repair include, among others:

- a depressed area in a fairway
- a rocky area in the fairway
- a newly sodded area in fairway or rough
- a tracked area left by equipment or carts
- a sand trap with multiple exposed rocks
- grass clippings that have been disposed of in the rough
- sunken ground in the vicinity of a man-made drain

In some competitions, ground under repair may be described in the rules of competition and not marked with white paint. An example of such an area would be "any bare or depressed areas immediately adjacent to or contiguous to any cart path".
