Use Your Clubs Wisely

I played in a scramble yesterday, where we played the white tees at another course, and I found myself hitting the driver, 8-iron, 9-iron, pitching wedge, and sand wedge a lot. I noticed that I very seldom, if ever, hit my hybrid, 4-iron, 5-iron, 6-iron or 7-iron nor my 5-wood or 3-wood. I could see myself getting comfortable with that and hoping that this would be all the clubs I would ever hit. Well, I don't think the game works like that if you play other courses, play your own individual ball, or play a longer course. By playing the shorter clubs more frequently, you become accustomed to hitting down into the ball at a steeper angle. Technically, that is what you're supposed to do, but that doesn't work as well for the fairway woods, hybrids, and longer irons. We must remember to play the ball a little forward, take the club back lower, and on a longer swing arc to create a shallower downward swing. This will ensure proper launch and distance. Try mixing up your shots next time you play; hit the clubs in the back of your bag that have accumulated some dust. This will make you a more rounded, all around better golfer.
